DAY 1 – Thursday, August 27: Evening departure U.S. to Paris, France (3 nights in Paris)

DAY 2 – Friday, August 28: Morning Arrival, Guided Tour of Notre Dame, the Île de la Cité and Île Saint Louis

Arrive in Paris. You will be welcomed to this enchanting and historic city and transferred to our elegant boutique hotel. Once you are settled, you will begin your journey with a private tour of the iconic Notre Dame, where you can admire the incredible restoration efforts that have brought this masterpiece back to life.

DAY 3 – Saturday August 29: Champs-Elysées and Musée de l'Orangerie

Stroll the Champs-Elysées

On the other side of Place de la Concorde are the Champs-Élysées: one of the world's most famous avenues, a huge tree-lined boulevard with some of the best shopping and dining in the city as well as beautiful architecture. Enjoy window shopping as we walk along this historic avenue.

Musée de l'Orangerie

We'll visit the Musée de l'Orangerie, a peaceful gem tucked into the Tuileries Garden. Inside, you'll step into Monet's oval rooms, where his Water Lilies surround you in soft light and shifting color—it's like walking into a painting. Then we'll explore works by Renoir, Cézanne, Modigliani, and Picasso, all part of a beautifully curated collection that traces the rise of modern art. It's a relaxed, inspiring stop that offers a quieter, more intimate look at Paris's artistic soul.

Quartier Latin - Free Time for Shopping

Wander through the Quartier Latin's cobbled streets, where student life, old bookshops, and lively cafés create a timeless Parisian rhythm. From the steps of the Panthéon to the banks of the Seine, every turn reveals a new layer of charm. It's the perfect neighborhood for a relaxed, story-filled stroll

Evening

[L'AURA at Les Invalides](#) is a 50-minute nighttime light and sound show inside the Dôme des Invalides. Using video mapping, music, and lighting effects, it highlights the architecture and history of this iconic monument, including Napoleon's tomb. The experience runs in the evening with timed entries and offers a unique, modern way to explore one of Paris's most historic sites.

Opera Garnier Highlights Private Guided Tour

In this two-hour tour, you will learn about history, Opera and Ballet. The Palais Garnier, an architectural masterpiece inaugurated in 1875 at the request of Napoleon III, is without doubt one of the most dazzling monuments in Paris. A world of elegance, not to be missed! To visit the Palais Garnier is to enter a realm of pomp and refinement in which the poetry, audacity and genius of Charles Garnier have managed to create a unique harmony between the sculpture, painting and architecture. A showcase for dance and opera, the building dazzles with its balconies in onyx, its luxurious marble, its delicate frescoes and its rich gilding. A real gem in the heart of Paris. From the monumental staircase to the majestic Grand Salon, each room of the Palais Garnier is full of elegant details that compose a magical decor. An architectural symphony, created by using several styles. And an architectural ‘first’ at the time, it was to inspire other buildings, making it an exceptional monument! Along with your guide, you will discover the entire Opera Garnier: the salons, the library, the showroom, the terrace and more.

Dinner cruise on the Seine River

Wrap up Paris and see the City of Lights as it was meant to be seen. At dusk, Paris transforms into a glittering light show. Climb aboard a boat for a dinner cruise along the Seine river in central Paris, and enjoy a 3-course meal as you take in views of the lit monuments. The entirely glassed-in boat is of a contemporary design, with onboard toilets for your comfort. See the historic quays of the Seine and cruise past the golden dome of Les Invalides. Marvel at the impressive buildings of the French Parliament and the Musée d’Orsay, the former Beaux-Arts railway station, and of course the sparkling Eiffel Tower. Get up close to the Gothic façade of Notre Dame Cathedral, see the imposing former prison of the Conciergerie and cruise under some of the city’s most historic bridges.



Known as the “Venice of Provence,” it’s a perfect blend of natural beauty and cultural flair—ideal for a relaxed day of strolling, browsing, and soaking in the ambiance

DAY 8 – Thursday, September 3: Free morning in Avignon – Palais de Papes tour in the afternoon

Make the most of your free morning with an activity of your choice.

Suggestion : Pont Benezet

The Saint Bénézet bridge, also known as Pont d'Avignon, is a true feat of engineering, and is continually being worked on and repaired. Built from the 12th century, the bridge originally spanned approximately 900 meters and had 22 arches. It was dismantled in 1226, then rebuilt. It was later washed away several times by flood waters and rebuilt until it was abandoned in the 17th century. Today, all that remains are four arches and a chapel dedicated to Saint Nicolas. It is now classified as World Heritage by UNESCO.

Stroll the boutique-lined streets and vibrant squares, dine in some excellent restaurants and see the impressive medieval wall that encircles the old city.



Afternoon Guided Tour of the Palais des Papes

The main attraction in Avignon is another of Provence's UNESCO World Heritage Sites, the **Palais des Papes**. It's one of the largest medieval Gothic buildings in Europe, former home to nine successive popes during the 14th century.

It took less than 20 years to build this immense religious structure with imposing walls and four impressive towers. Tours take visitors through 25 rooms. Must-see rooms include the Consistoire (Audience Room), the Grande

Chapelle (Great Chapel), the Grand Tinel (Banquet Hall), and the private papal apartments. The views from the towers are the most sublime place to take in the city, the Rhône River and the famous Pont d'Avignon (Pont Saint-Bénézet).

The Pont d'Avignon is a testament to the exciting history of the capital of Vaucluse. Built between 1177 and 1185, the Saint-Bénézet Bridge, known as the "Pont d'Avignon," once connected Avignon with Villeneuve-les-Avignon. After extensive repeated damage from war and flooding, only four of the original 22 arches remain today. When it was built it was the only link over the Rhone River between Lyon and the Mediterranean Sea.

Sample the Papalines d'Avignon, chocolate specialties made with aromatic oregano liqueur from Mont Ventoux. They are handmade and only sold by shops affiliated with the Vaucluse master confectioners. Five tons are sold each year! The asparagus is worth trying too during the spring season. It's widely celebrated in Avignon - nearly every menu in town has fresh asparagus soup, roasted green asparagus, or the white variety lightly sautéed and served with sauce.

The best buys are to be found in the city's fantastic array of funky little designer and craft boutiques, and its small but select range of shops offering fine regional food and drink specialties.

These are mainly found in the part of town between the Tourist Office at 41 cours Jean Jaurès and the gourmet Les Halles food market on place Pie. A number of these narrow alleys have been recently pedestrianised, and now this part of Avignon is really pleasant to stroll around.

**DAY 9 – Friday, September 4:
Lourmarin – Cassis**

Lourmarin Market Day - Set under the plane trees along Boulevard du Rayol and Place Henri Barthélémy, this lively Provençal market features around 80 stalls offering everything from fresh produce and cheeses to clothing, crafts, and olive wood goods. It's a vibrant weekly event that draws locals and visitors alike for shopping, strolling, and soaking in the village atmosphere.
